A Listing of Recordings

This isn't even remotely a discography. It is cobbled together from various sources, notably the *Encyclopedic Discography of Victor Recordings* (both the online version and the wonderful printed v. 2), the notes to the Marston CD issue of Plançon's G&T's and Zonophones, the online version of the booklet accompanying the NYPL LP issue of the Maplesons, and Hevingham-Root's Plançon discography in the 1953 *Record Collector*. In sum, there isn't a lick of original research in it.

All selections sung in French except as noted.

Speeds are from the Encyclopedic Discography of Victor Recordings (i.e., determined by William R. Moran). Keys of the G&T's are from Laurie Hevingham-Root's discography in *The Record Collector*.

I have intentionally totally ignored all LP and most CD reissues because I don't care about them at all. L001 is a Marston CD reissue of all the G&T's and Zonophones. 82001-2 A and 82001-2 B is a Romophone CD reissue of all the Victors. 1100 is a Symposium CD reissue of many of the G&T London Reds, including some by Plançon; it is v. 8 in the series The Harold Wayne Collection.

No copies of the Bettini cylinders are likely to exist; however, they are listed for the sake of completeness. All but the *Faust* appear in either the June 1898 or April 1900 catalogs; the *Faust* is listed in Hevingham-Root's discography in *The Record Collector*.

A ">" before an entry means that I have that record in my collection. The same symbol before a record number means that I have a copy of that issue. (Normally there will be at least two ">" characters, one beside the entry, the other beside the record number actually in my collection.)

Notes

2. This record is not listed in any of the facsimile Bettini catalogs I have. However, the April 1900 catalog, which lists recordings by Plançon numbered 1-3 gives no title or composer for number 2. Perhaps this number two is actually the *Faust* aria.

3, 13, 14, 38, 70, 75, 79. The incipit is often given as "Enfin chérie." This mistake dates back at least as far as Hevingham-Root's discography in the 1953 *Record Collector* and was carried into the *Encyclopedic Discography of Victor Recordings*. However, the full score (Paris: Bureau central de musique, [1849]), p. 115, has "Enfant chéri " as the first two words. "Enfant chéri" also matches what it sounds like Plançon, who had superb diction, actually sings. (See also specific notes for some recordings of this aria below.)

8. Other possible dates are 4 Jan 1901 and 26 Feb 1901, both with Edouard de Reszke as Méphistophélès. The NYPL, in consultation with John Stratton and Philip L. Miller, believe the Marguerite to be Melba, which is supported by voiceprint evidence. "Stratton and Miller incline to the March 28 cast...."

13, 15. My copy has a space, not a hyphen, between the numeric and alphabetic portion of the matrix number.

13, 15-16. EDVR quotes Kelly's date of May 1902.

16-17. Hevingham-Root, "Pol Plançon--A Discographical Survey," p. 158, lists only matrix 1925-B (which he gives as 1925ⁱⁱ-G), and lists Victor 91016 as one of the numbers on which it was issued. In his "The London Red G&Ts of 1902," p. 19, he lists matrices 1925-G and 1925ⁱⁱ-G, and makes no distinction which take was issued on which record number. However, the *Encyclopedic Discography of Victor Recordings*, online version, shows only matrix 1925-B (i.e., 1925ⁱⁱ-G) issued on 91016.

19-21, 23, 32. According to notes to Marston L001, transposed down a minor second.

22. EDVR quotes Kelly's date of 30 May 1902.

27. WG 3901-R would be a fair guess at the matrix number.

42. EDVR says this was performed transposed down a minor second.

48. EDVR says piano & voice end together; playing time 3:14 at 80.00 rpm.

51. The online version of the EDVR shows B 1053-1 as being another recording of Embarquez-vous. However, the print version says this matrix is by Dudley. I believe the print version is correct and so I have omitted B 1053-1 here.

53. EDVR says piano after voice at end; playing time 3:12 at 76.00 rpm.

59. EDVR lists 3-32666, but this looks like an error, since this would be a ten-inch record.

60. EDVR says pressings after about 1915 were S/8.

75. EDVR says final "et" in "et l'honneur" sung on D.

76. EDVR says S/8 pressings made from master duplicated 25 Oct 1915. 6347 issued only in Canada; Canadian pressings from original master.

77. EDVR says S/8 pressings made from master duplicated 2 Dec 1915.

79. EDVR says final "et" in "et l'honneur" sung on E. "Take 4 not found in ledgers."

84. EDVR says Victor files indicate this was sung in French.
